



This past year has been a challenge on many fronts for the vast membership of AAPS, but we have been able to stand firm on our values and Code of Ethics.



Andre LuJan is an experienced paleontologist and entrepreneur who established PaleoTex LLC in Texas in 2016 and became sole owner in 2023. PaleoTex is a professional services company with a lab space fully equipped to provide fossil & mineral preparation, restoration. moldina. casting. and mounting services. Additionally, Mr. LuJan offers field paleontology services, including consultations, mapping, excavation, heavy machine work and logistics in remote places throughout the country.

He founded Andre LuJan Lux Paleo Services, his own high-end consulting agency in 2023 that caters to celebrities and high-profile clientele offering a full range of luxury paleontological services including white glove installation, consulting, procurement, brokering, fossil restoration and repair.

His role entails helping develop a job training certification in paleo technology to provide a pathway for the next generation of experts in the field. As an expert in his field, Mr. LuJan has also been affiliated with several well-known paleontologists and other institutions and is frequently called upon for his insight. He has also become a notable spokesperson for various media outlets, such as NPR and the History Channel.

Having previously focused his career on environmental science, Andre was employed by LCA Environmental Inc. from 2012 to 2018 as an environmental project manager. In this capacity, he provided various environmental services, such as abatement monitoring and documentation, asbestos surveys, report writing, and air sample analysis via phase contrast microscopy. Mr. LuJan also monitored demolition and assisted with lead-based paint inspections, mold, and indoor air quality assessments.

Active various civic in roles. Andre is the co-founder and executive director of Texas Through Time Inc. with his wife, Carrie LuJan, a nonprofit museum in Hillsboro, Texas, devoted to showcasing authentic fossils from Texas and surrounding states since 2018. His overarching goal includes helping the organization become a nationally recognized institution that offers significant research program opportunities. This dream has been realized with a recent donation of a 40,000 square foot historic school building to the nonprofit that will be the permanent home of the institution. additionally a \$144,000 grant from the City of Hillsboro will help replace the building's

178 windows. Moreover, Mr. LuJan has been active as a board member of the Hillsboro Main Street Committee in Hillsboro from 2019-2023 and has served as Election Judge in 2022 and 2023.

- 5. Report to scientific experts any significant discoveries of scientific or public interest.
- 6. Strive to place specimens of unique scientific interest into responsible hands for study, research and preservation.
- 7. Make no misrepresentation as to identity, locality, age, formation, repairs or restoration of paleontological specimens.
- Members will strive for best business practices in all aspects of business, dealing with customers and other AAPS members in a fair and honest manner and maintaining a good credit standing. AAPS encourages members to follow good ethics but cannot act as a resource to settle disputes between said members or disputes involving customers.
- 9. Encourage good relations and cooperation with agencies, institutions, and organizations actively involved in paleontological pursuits.

The History of the AAPS

by Neal L. Larson

Nearly all of the fossil dealers attending the Tucson Gem and Mineral show in 1979 met in the Marriot Hotel near the convention center in downtown Tucson, to form the American Association of Paleontological Suppliers (AAPS). This new organization was to serve as a united voice for the fossil industry to promote ourselves as ethical professionals in the field of paleontology. It was at this meeting that our Constitution and Code of Ethics was conceived. These two important documents were drafted over the course of the following year. Allen Graffham of Geological Enterprises was elected as the first president of this organization. Bob Harris was elected Vice President, and James Honert, secretary-treasurer.

AAPS members met for their second annual meeting, again in Tucson in February 1978 to ratify the constitution and Code of Ethics that had been hashed out over the year as well as to make plans for the future. The newly formed organization did not believe that every fossil collector should be able to become a member as some did not seemingly have the highest ethics. It was decided that prospective new members had to be nominated by a current member and elected by a majority of the membership; a single member could reject any nominee and that would void the nomination. All new members were elected that way until 1997 when, under the leadership of Bill Mason, membership was opened up all fossil businesses if they paid their dues and agreed to comply with the AAPS Code of Ethics. Associate and Honorary Members were allowed as early as 1980. Annual dues were originally \$50 and stayed that way until the 1997 when they were reduced to \$10 to attract more businesses. Associate members have no vote and do not have to pay dues.

2023 Honolulu Show Report

- 1. More than 96% of dealers renewed for 2024
- 2. Three dealers had their best show ever (one of them on opening day)
- 3. Nearly half of the 2023 dealers increased their booth size for 2024

Ninety dealers signed up for the inaugural 2023 show, but due to illness, visa issues, etc. we hosted 72 dealers. Our brochures were mailed to 312,000 homes on Oahu. However, the \$10 entry price narrowed attendance to 8,000 'serious' customers. Opening day was slow, but by Friday crowds were common and Saturday was busy. Sunday was also busy with buyers returning from the day before because the ATMs had run out of money. The dealer experience was *joyful*. On set-up day, UPS had their pallets awaiting them at their booths. The Hawaii Convention Center was convenient, sales were higher than expected, the weather was blissful, our hotel was wonderful, the HCC staff and customers were warm and friendly, and the aloha spirit filled us all.

Most of the fossil businesses attending the 1979 Tucson show (only about 30) were brought together by promoter George Topham who is credited with organizing the first fossil show at the Sheraton Pueblo (commonly known as the Pueblo, now known as the Ramada by Wyndham). At this time, several new members were added. Throughout the 1980's, the organization continued to grow and add more members, mostly those associated with the Fossil Show at the Pueblo. By the early 1990's there were more than 60 member businesses and several Associate members of the AAPS. By 1989 the fossil show moved to the Ramada Inn on Oracle with mineral dealer, turned show promoter, Marty Zinn. That hotel changed its name several times becoming the Vagabond 2003. In 2005 the fossil show moved to the Inn Suites with Marty Zinn as well as the new Days Inn along St. Mary's Road.

Hotels are bought and sold, trashed and remodeled so the same names seem to keep coming back. 2020 marked the final year for the Inn Suites Show. Now the Tucson Fossil show has gone ³/₄ circle coming back to be centrally located near the old Ramada/Vagabond. Most of the fossil dealers can be found at the Ramada Inn off of St. Mary's Road, at the Mineral and Fossil Coop 1635 N. Oracle and at the Mineral and Fossil Marketplace 1333 N. Oracle. It looks like this should be the central locations for nearly all future shows in Tucson as Mineral City and so many other dealers are all permanently located in this area.

Since the mid-1980's AAPS has held its second annual meeting and get together during the Denver Show in Tucson. For more than 20 years it was easy as most members met at the Denver Merchandise Mart where Marty Zinn had organized a five day show in conjunction with the Denver Mineral Societies annual show. Since that time our members have scattered to two locations at the Airport Crowne Plaza and the National Western Complex and Denver Coliseum. Unfortunately, with the great distance between the two shows these annual meetings are poorly attended.

Annual Auction and Banquet

The annual AAPS banquet and auction is one of highlights of the annual Tucson show. The banquet is usually held on the second Saturday of the Tucson Show and is really the only opportunity for most of the members to reconnect, visit, and meet new members and supporters every year. This sold-out event is important for the health of organization. Our annual meeting is held, Grant and Scholarship recipients are selected and Board and Officers are elected. Following the food is our great fundraiser, the Auction.

1333 N Oracle Rd. Tucson, AZ 85705 AAPS Auctions began in the Pueblo bar as early as 1983 when we came up with the solution to help raise more funds for our organization. Dennis Kingery was the main auctioneer (with assistance from Neal Larson) until 1988 when professional auctioneer Sherm Beyers (Burning Tree Mastodon) conducted the auction. Dennis was so hurt by this change he dropped his membership and never returned no matter how many apologies were offered. From 1990 the annual auction has had Neal Larson as the main auctioneer (with the exception of 1992 and 1995) with many other members helping out. Over the years our auctions have raised hundreds of thousands of dollars with most of that money going for scholarships and paying most of our bills.

Bill Mason's infamous Lab Coat has been the single largest fundraiser for the AAPS Auctions since its donation on 1995. During that initial donation, Bill Hawes asked literally to be able to bid on the "shirt off of Bill's back", which is what happened. Bill Mason requested that he be allowed to buy it back the following year and history was made. Since 1995 the coat has been auctioned off 30 times (sometimes for \$1,000 or more). Since 2017 the Lab Coat "Owner" gets to be the AAPS Advocate and with that honor gets a bonus write-up (as many as 3 pages) in the directory about them and their business.

Beginning first in 2021, because there was no formal banquet or auction, Heritage Auction has taken over a large portion of our fundraising. Selecting pieces from donations made by members and friends, they sell off some of the most enticing items at a special auction geared specifically to raise money for AAPS. As a result, our auction totals have substantially increased by several factors thanks to past-president and Natural History specialist at Heritage, Craig Kissick.

Paleontological Collecting Guidelines, the NAS Report

In the 1980's a national committee was formed to determine what extent the federal land managers should control or restrict fossil collection on public lands. The question that controlled the narrative at these meetings was "How should government protect and preserve fossils of extinct plants and animals while at the same time allowing other legitimate uses of the land and encouraging the scientific study of fossils" (1987 NAS report p. 1 executive summary).

The committee selected to come up with solutions for this endeavor was selected from the professional paleontological community to mining industry and the commercial fossil business. The 13 committee members included **Peter Larson** (Black Hills Institute and newly elected president of AAPS),

Donald Wolberg (NM Bureau of Mines and Mineral Resources), as well as top paleontology/geology/mining people from the Univ. of Chicago, L.A. County Museum, Sandra Univ. of Denver, Utah International Inc., Harvard Univ., U.S. Geol. Survey, Univ. of CO Museum, NM Energy and Minerals Dept., Univ. of CA, and the Univ. of OK. Though the committee was widely varied, they found that they could not cover all of the different aspect of the subject from all different viewpoints so they assisted help from seven different Liaison members (that included other top people from the Bureau of Land Management, US Geol. Survey, Dept. of Energy, National Science Foundation, National Park Service, Atlantic Richfield Foundation and the Dept. of the Interior.

This committee had six formal meetings over two years studying the legal history and interpretations of fossil collecting in this country as well as in Great Britain and Canada. They thoroughly reviewed the pros and cons as well as the legal ramifications regarding fossil collecting as vaguely interpreted by the different cited acts: the 1872 Mining Law, the Antiquities Act of 1906, the Historic Sites Act of 1935, the Materials Act of 1947, the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969, the Surface Mining Control and Reclamation Act of 1977, the Archaeological Resources Protection Act of 1979, as well as reviewing Congress's 1962 directive to the Secretary of the Interior to allow for the collecting of limited quantities of petrified wood without a permit.

The findings of this committee were published by National Academy Press, Washington, D.C. in 1987 as a 243-page document simply entitled **Paleontological Collecting**. Their ten-point conclusions and recommendations to all of the Federal Agencies that would be writing their own regulations can be found on pages 24-26 of that report. Three of the major recommendations were:

#3, "All public lands should be open to fossil collecting for scientific purposes. Except in cases involving quarrying or commercial collection, collecting fossils on public lands should not be subject to permit requirements of other regulation."

#4, "Fossils of scientific significance should be deposited in institutions where there established research and educational programs in paleontology....."

#5, "Commercial collecting of fossils from public lands should be regulated to minimize the risk of losing fossils and data of importance to paleontology. Permit applications must be subject to review by paleontologists qualified to assess the projects potential impact on related research programs....

The NAS recommendations were unfortunately never implemented by any of the Federal agencies. For decades AAPS actively strove for common sense into regulations and petitioned them to at least recognize and address these recommendations but to no avail. Inserted into the Omnibus Bill in 2012, Congress directed the various land management agencies to come up with regulations that would protect and preserve the fossil resources of this nation for present and future generations. AAPS tried to get the Forest Service to make fossil collecting on public lands accessible but to no avail. We also thought that we may have a chance with the BLM when they were writing theirs, and although they really listened there was still little give. Unfortunately, most of the different agencies have independently seemingly criminalized all but some amateur collecting on public lands. All agencies have seemingly ignored the directive by Congress to protect and preserve the fossil resources of this nation for present and future generations. Rather it seems that the Federal Agencies would rather have our paleontological resources weather away into dust, rather than have them collected and preserved.

Change of Name

The IAPS (International Association of Paleontological Suppliers) was created in the early 1990's to help foreign businesses organize and become aware of the US and other countries legislation regarding the import and export of fossils from different countries in the world. The first president of this organization was Kirby Siber (Siber & Siber) from Aathol, Switzerland. The organization adopted the code of ethics of the AAPS, and used the AAPS constitution as a guideline for their constitution. The IAPS disbanded and their members all joined AAPS in 2000. Since we had many want-to-be members from other countries it was determined that AAPS should incorporate under a full encompassing name. At the Denver show in September 2002, the Association of Applied Paleontological Sciences (AAPS), was born, this new organization was composed of the former American Association of Paleontological Suppliers (IAPS).

Grants and Scholarships

It became apparent that we should do something more with our funds than to use them to fight government legislation, so in 1990 we started the **James Welch Scholarship**. This scholarship was named as a memorial for member, James Welch of Montana Geological Materials, of Billings, Montana, who died of a heart attack while collecting fossils at Glass Mountain, in the Permian of Texas. Jim was an avid invertebrate collector specializing in Bearpaw Shale ammonites and also other invertebrates from the western United States. This scholarship is meant to assist graduate level students doing research in macro vertebrate fossils.

In 1992 we added a scholarship for vertebrate paleo students and created the **Charles Sternberg Scholarship** meant to assist graduate level students doing research in macro vertebrate fossils. From 1990 until 1995 we worked quite closely with the Paleo Society who chose the recipients to award our scholarships. Over the last two decades AAPS has been attempting to honor some of our most influential members that made a real difference in our profession and in the world of paleontology. Unfortunately, many of us are not getting any older so every year we are now seeming to lose those members who were always there. Below is a brief synopsis of the different ideas we have taken on to promote our industry while honoring some of those who truly made a difference.

The **A. Allen Graffham Research Grant** was created in 2006 and named for the man who had created one of the most successful mail order fossil supply houses ever. Allen started the business in 1945, settling in Ardmore OK in the heart of the Arbuckle Mts where he had access to so many great fossils of all ages. He was not only this organizations' first president but the inspiration to the next generation of fossil collectors – us. This grant is available to any researcher or student in paleontology that will publish on specimens collected by or in collaboration with any member of AAPS. The grant was originally funded by Geological Enterprises until 2009 when it was decided that proceeds from the annual auction would help support it.

The **René Vanderveldt Research Grant** was created in 2007, first recipient in 2008 and is funded by Korite International and Canada Fossils. Rene' was the driving force behind Canada Fossils and Korite, inspirational in coining the name "Ammolite" for the gemstone of ammonite shell and making it known worldwide. This grant is available to qualified researchers working on the marine paleontology, geology, or stratigraphy of the Late Cretaceous Pierre and Bearpaw Shales of North America.

The largest and most complete fossil skeleton of the most famous dinosaur Species in the world will be sold at Southery's New York on 4 October 1997. The massive Tyrannosaurus Rex skeleton was discovered near Faith, South Dakota, in August 1990. Approximately 90 percent Complete by bone count (and more than 90 percent complete by volume, since most of the missing ones are relatively small). This example dwarfs all other known T. rex skeletons and has become universally known as "Sue" after Susan Hendrikson. The field paleontologist who found it weathering out of the Dakota high prairies.

The fossil remains of "Sue" have been partialy prepared by the Black Hills Institute of Geological Research. As a result, the display of the specimen provides a comprehensive overview of the preparation process from fossils still locked inside their rocky and sedimentary "matrix" to access partially cleaned or still housed in their plaster field jackets, to fully cleaned magnificently detailed fossils. In addition to the near-pristine state of preservation of the fossil, the most intriguing aspect of "Sue" is the number of evident pathologies displayed by the bones: a broken and healed left fibula, broken and healed ribs, broken and healed tail bones, and bite and puncture marks on the left side of the skull. Much of the attention "Sue" has received has focused on determining the gender of the specimen. Because of the dinosaur's nickname, the popular conception of "Sue" as female is well established, but there may be scholarly evidence to support that determination as well.

Whatever the final determination of "Sue"'s gender, thespecimen will continue to both raise and answer questions about tyrannosaurs for decades to come. The virtual completeness of the skeleton will allow more accurate reconstructions of the posture and size of Tyrannosaurus rex-in the case of "Sue" a standing height of at least 13 ½ feet at the hip and a total length of more then 4o feet. Most importantly, this new body of physical evidence will allow further research into the mystery of Tyrannosaurus behavior, including the unsolved debate about whether the king of the tyrant lizards was a ferocious predator or an opportunistic scavenger. "Sue" has confirmend much that was speculated about T. rex - and has also provided a wealth of material for new speculation. Although several more specimens have been excavated since "Sue" was found, she seems certain to remain the standard against which all other Tyrannosaurs will be measured

Dan and Hope were the owners of Caveman Lapidary and an avid supporter of AAPS. Dan's specialty was petrified wood, but their business really captivated the old rockhound spirit of everything from rocks, minerals, fossils and lapidary. This educational grant has been supported by his family, primarily Ed and Annette Rigel.

We honor the memory of Bill Mason, past president of AAPS and creator of Paleobond products and all things great to preserve fossils, minerals and meteorites from everything the world has to throw at them with the **William H. Mason III Preparators' Grant**. These monies are to be used to assist both academic and commercial preparators working on fossil or meteorite specimens that will be displayed in a public museum, or will become part of a permanent research collection.

David Kronen, Bone Clones, was a force in the innovative and delicate business of mold and replica making. His replicas are the finest in the world. David was a long time AAPS officer and board member plus huge supporter of all of our scholarships, often gifting scholarship money to second and third place finishers if he believed in their research. The **David Kronen Casting and Molding Grant** is a \$1,000 grant created to support the casting, molding, and/or 3D scanning and printing of commercially collected paleontological specimens. It is available to any interested party working on a commercially collected specimen, with the condition that replicas of the specimen be used to further public education and/or research

Finally, the **Charles H. Sternberg Medal** was created by the Association of Applied Paleontological Sciences (AAPS) in January of 2003 to honor very special friends and members of our organization who have given a large portion of their life to paleontology. This is the highest honor that our organization can bestow on any person, whether they are an AAPS member or not, and includes Honorary Life Membership. Our organization has been gifted with so many unselfish, gifted and generous members. Please put your name out to be an officer or board member and work at trying to make a difference in our industry. There is almost no other job that is as fulfilling as working to protect and preserve our fossil resources and our right to do so.

The association continues to grow and fight for the individual rights to legally collect and preserve fossils for future generations.
